Spectator Handbook

Ride Weekend and Gravel Day



Spectators are such an important part of the Pelotonia experiences! Find all the information you need to spectate safely here, and visit <u>pelotonia.org/cheer</u> for more info!

How can I contribute if I don't want to Ride or Volunteer?

Pelotonia's mission is to raise money for cancer research. If you're unable to participate as a Rider or Volunteer, but would still like to fundraise, you can become a Challenger. Please visit **pelotonia.org** for additional information and to register.

What happens if my participant is injured during Ride Weekend or Gravel Day?

If a participant is hurt or otherwise unable to finish, support vehicles or First Aid volunteers will provide appropriate first aid assistance and will contact EMT services if necessary. If a participant is transported to a medical facility, the participant's designated emergency contact person will be notified immediately. If a participant does not need to be transported for an injury but is otherwise unable to finish, support vehicles will transport them to the nearest finish area where they may be picked up or take a shuttle back to a start location.

Where and how can I cheer on my Rider or Runner/Hiker?

During Ride Weekend, cheer on Riders along the route and at finish lines! Use alternate roads to avoid the route and park away from it to keep Riders safe (all route maps can be viewed at **pelotonia.org/ride-weekend**). Follow all directions from law enforcement, volunteers, and signage for guest parking. Rest stops, including the lunch stop, are off-limits to guests for Rider safety. Spray painting public roads is strictly prohibited by law.

During Gravel Day, guests are also welcome to cheer on Riders along the route, and cheer on Riders, Runners and Hikers as they finish at Snow Fork Event Center. Again, use alternate roads to avoid the routes (all route maps can be viewed at pelotonia.org/gravel-day) and spectators should avoid arriving to Snow Fork between 8:15am-10:00am as cyclists take off.



How can I track my participant and know where they are on the route?

All spectators can download the "Pelotonia Tracker" from the Apple or Google Play store on your mobile device. This app allows family and friends to view progress throughout the Ride or Run/Hike, including receiving push notifications when participants arrive at and leave rest stops, and are approaching their finish line.

To follow a participant, spectators should download the app to their mobile device, click on the appropriate event (Ride Weekend or Gravel Day), choose the "Tracker" option at the bottom of the screen, then click on the search icon in the upper left hand corner to search for a participant and click the participant's name in the search results. This will add that participant to the main screen of a spectator's app to view their progress and also give the option to subscribe to push notifications for that participant.

What accessibility accommodations are available for spectators?

Pelotonia is committed to providing an inclusive experience and furthering accessibility for all spectators regardless of ability, both apparent and non-apparent.

Accessible parking and restrooms are available at all start and finish venues, as well as other accommodations across Ride Weekend and Gravel Day. Please visit **pelotonia.org/ ride-weekend/accessibility** for more information about accessibility at Pelotonia events.

Picking Up Riders on Ride Weekend

How do I pick up my Rider at New Albany Schools? New Albany Schools are located at 6600 E Dublin Granville Rd, New Albany, OH 43054. Please do not proceed along the route to reach this destination. We anticipate that most 24-mile Riders will reach New Albany Schools between 9:00am and 1:00pm. On Sunday, we anticipate that most 30-mile Riders will finish between 10:00am and 1:00pm, and most 90-mile Riders will finish between 11:00am and 4:00pm. There is parking available at Market Square, or off-site parking with a continuous shuttle will also be available at 6500 New Albany Rd E. New Albany OH 43054.

Please note: The New Albany Schools finish celebration has moved, so parking locations will be different than in past years. All spectators should access the finish venue by using the New Albany Road exit from 161 and traveling north toward off-site parking or south to Fodor Rd. to access Market Square.

How do I pick up my Rider at Abercrombie & Fitch Co.? Abercrombie & Fitch Co. is located at 7906 Central College, New Albany, OH 43054. All guests must access the property from Central College Rd., as vehicular traffic will be prohibited from the Smith's Mill Road entrance. We anticipate that most 50-mile Riders will reach the finish between 9:30am and 2:00pm. Please look for areas designated as Guest Parking.

How do I pick up my Rider at Kenyon College?

Riders will finish at the Lowry Center, which is located at 221 Duff Street, Gambier, Ohio 43022. Please do not proceed along the route to reach this destination. We anticipate that most 63-mile and 100-mile Riders will reach Gambier between 11:00am and 6:00pm. Guests should enter Kenyon College from Newcastle Road (Route 229) using Duff Street and park in the lots near the Lowry Center.

Please take care when approaching guest parking on Kenyon's campus as you may need to cross the route to access parking areas. Please look for areas designated as Guest Parking and follow the direction of parking attendants at all times.

Picking Up Participants at Gravel Day

How do I pick up my participant at Snow Fork Event Center?

Snow Fork Event Center should be accessed via the designated vehicle entrance near 5879 Happy Hollow Road. Please use caution when traveling to the venue, as Riders will be utilizing the roadways around the venue. We anticipate that most 11-Mile Riders will finish between 10:00am-11:30am, most 25-Mile Riders will finish between 10:30am-1:00pm, and most 48-mile Riders will arrive between 12:00pm-4pm. Please follow the direction of all Pelotonia Volunteers and parking attendants to safely access the venue.


